"Christians Need the Gospel, Too"

¹⁸ For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

¹⁹ For it is written, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart."

²⁰ Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? ²¹ For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe. ²² For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, ²³ but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, ²⁴ but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. ²⁵ For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men. (1 Cor 1:18–25 ESV)

We know that unbelievers need the gospel. For those looking for peace and forgiveness, the cross and resurrection of Jesus is very good news.

We know the gospel is important to us. We have come to trust in Jesus for our salvation. We believe that we have become children of God through faith in the Son. "How precious did that grace appear the hour we first believed."

But what about this hour? We needed the gospel to be saved. Do we still need it? Paul seems to think so. We are still be saved by word of the cross which is the power of God. That's why he told the Corinthians: "For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified." (1 Cor 2:2 ESV). It is why he was eager to preach the gospel to the Christians in Rome. (Romans 1:15) Preaching the gospel to Christians!

We need to keep hearing and believing the good news of Jesus. It keeps us humble. It reminds us that we are sinners who need to repent every day. It keeps us from despair, knowing that we are washed clean by the blood of Christ.

In an article in Tabletalk Magazine, Joe Thorn writes: "Fundamentally, the gospel is forgotten when it no longer functions as our ongoing hope and confidence before God, or when it becomes unessential for the practical, daily living of the Christian life. The gospel we often forget must be reclaimed and retained for the safety of our souls, and this is done through preaching the gospel to ourselves." (Jan 1, 2015).

We still need the gospel. It is still good news. Preach it to yourself today.

(Eph 3:16–19 ESV)

<u>March 26</u> Galatians 5:13-25 **"Living the Gospel Out"**

¹⁶ But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. ¹⁷ For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. (Gal 5:16–18 ESV)
